

Emergency Access to Medicine Scheme February 2019

Wiltshire CCG set up this Scheme to start on 1st December 2015. The purpose of this scheme was, and continues to be, to ensure prompt access to certain prescription-only medicines that may be needed in an emergency from pharmacies spread across Wiltshire. These medicines include, but are not limited to, “End of Life” drugs.

The original service was commissioned via 6 community pharmacies which have recently been increased to 8.

The Medicines Management Team now coordinates and administers this service in collaboration with Swindon and Wiltshire Community Pharmacy (formerly known as Local Pharmaceutical Committee) via PharmaOutcomes. (PharmOutcomes is a web-based system which helps community pharmacies provide services more effectively and makes it easier for commissioners to audit and manage the provision of those services.)
